WHAT'S HAPPENING?

Tri-City Alliance Church for Sale

Some of you may have noticed the "For Sale" sign at the Tri-City Alliance Church located at the corner of Country Club Way and Guadalupe. The Church's need for a larger facility is forcing them to move further east, and they plan to move in three to six months. They have turned down an offer from a developer as they hope to sell the building to another church.

Western Canal Recreational Trail

Construction is anticipated to begin in late fall 2007 of a six-mile lighted recreation trail along the Western Canal from Arizona Mills Mall to the 101 freeway. The trail will consist of a ten foot wide concrete path with a soft jogging path along some areas. Various beautification/resting areas, including one at Stroud Park, will also be constructed. The City and contractor are working on determining which portion or areas will be completed first. Construction is anticipated to take one year.

City of Tempe will notify neighbors in advance of the construction activity in their neighborhood.

Annual Meeting

The Camelot Village Neighborhood Association (CVNA) held its Annual Meeting on Tuesday, April 24, 2007 at the Tri-City Alliance Church. Tempe City Councilmember Onnie Shekerjian and Tempe Neighborhood Services representative Elizabeth Thomas attended the meeting.

Councilmember Shekerjian discussed the capital budget, indicating that the planned upgrade of three parks a year, a new fire station for the Southeast Quadrant, a new police substation, and sewer system updates are among the projects included in the capital budget. Elizabeth Thomas indicated that the City sets aside \$225,000 each year out of the capital budget for grants to neighborhoods with a maximum per grant amount of \$12,000. Grant monies are to be used for upgrades not for maintenance. She indicated that Stroud Park improvements were graded Number 18 out of 48 projects.

Wendy Darling briefed the group on the status of the current grant and asked the group's approval to proceed with Phase III grant request to add shade structures to the playground at Stroud Park. Those present approved this request.

Meg Webster volunteered to serve as President for the coming year succeeding Wendy Darling. Other current year officers and committee chairs agreed to continue serving.

Grant Update - Stroud Park Improvements Phases I, II and III

Phase I, a concrete walkway to provide ADA required accessibility is complete. Phase II will be completed with the addition of benches and a new rock wall climbing structure with slide later this year. The slide on the west side of the park, which collects water, and the rocking ponies will be removed. Neighbors approved the Phase III plan for the addition of a shade structure for the playground. The Beautification Committee submitted a grant request in May to the City of Tempe for Phase III.

Block Watch provides an opportunity to meet your neighbors and better understand what is happening in the neighborhood. The requirements are minimal, the rewards are great. Don't wait until something happens to get involved.

Police encourage neighbors to watch for unusual or suspicious activity in the neighborhood and report immediately to the Police at **480-966-6211**. They emphasize they would rather have calls that turn out to be false alarms than have incidents occurring. **Emergencies only should be reported to 911.**

From time-to-time incidents do occur. In addition to notifying the Police, please report these incidents to your Block Watch Captain or to Sid Frede so they can arrange to alert neighbors to any major or recurring problems.

Protect Against Identity Theft

Officer Dan Brown of the Tempe Police Department provided the following information to address the identity theft issue:

1. "To obtain FREE credit reports contact www.annualcreditreport.com or call 877 322 8228. You can get one free report per year from each of the three companies listed on the website. This inquiry will not affect your score or be a

hard inquiry as it is self initiated by you. Ideally you could get one free report every four months by getting one from each company. Everyone should do this to ensure they are not already a victim of identity theft.

2. Shred your mail, pay your bills on line through your financial institution (with secure browser) and do not put out going mail in your home mailbox.

3. Remove your social security number from your driver's license.

4. Be protective of your social security number, do not carry your card in your purse wallet

5. Do not provide any information to callers, phone solicitors. If the deal is too good to be true, it probably is!

6. SHRED! SHRED! SHRED! "
